A BILL

To require that waivers and authorizations for certain Federal employees relating to ethics requirements are made public and submitted to the Office of Government Ethics, and for other purposes.

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "White House Ethics
- 5 Transparency Act of 2017".

1	SEC. 2. PROCEDURE FOR WAIVERS AND AUTHORIZATIONS
2	RELATING TO ETHICS REQUIREMENTS.
3	(a) In General.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
4	sion of law, not later than 30 days after an officer or em-
5	ployee issues or approves a waiver or authorization pursu-
6	ant to a provision listed in subsection (d) to a covered em-
7	ployee, such officer or employee shall—
8	(1) transmit a written copy of such waiver or
9	authorization to the Director of the Office of Gov-
10	ernment Ethics; and
11	(2) make a written copy of such waiver or au-
12	thorization available to the public on the website of
13	the employing agency of the covered employee.
14	(b) Retroactive Application.—In the case of a
15	waiver or authorization described in subsection (a) issued
16	during the period beginning on January 20, 2017, and
17	ending on the date of enactment of this Act, the issuing
18	officer or employee of such waiver or authorization shall
19	comply with the requirements of paragraphs (1) and (2)
20	of such subsection not later than 30 days after the date
21	of enactment of this Act.
22	(c) Office of Government Ethics Public Avail-
23	ABILITY.—Not later than 14 days after receiving a written
24	copy of a waiver or authorization under subsection (a)(1),
25	the Director of the Office of Government Ethics shall

ary 20th, 2017.
